As a result, many elections are no longer competitive, voters feel that the issues that matter are not addressed, and the partisan gridlock in Harrisburg and Washington gets worse. Politicians, as well as voters, are pawns in a partisan duopoly.

A speaker from Fair Districts PA will give a presentation to explain **the why and the how of the current process of Congressional and PA legislative redistricting**, as well as the proposed solution to take the process out of the direct hands of sitting politicians, turning it over to an independent commission.
