Summer reading is here, and I have a few books to mention that I think will fit your reading needs. Emily Henry's new book, *Happy Place* was wonderful. I have become very fond of this author. The plot isn't unusual or earthshaking; it's about 5 college friends who have stayed together and how their relationships shaped their lives. I loved Harriet, the protagonist, and Wynn. This is told in real-time through flashbacks. It kept me engaged until I finished—which I did in one day. Another author I have become particularly fond of is Heather Webber. I just finished *In the Middle of Hickory Lane*. I love the characters, setting, and hint of magic that she seems to incorporate in all her books. There is also a mystery in this one. Emme Wynn has come to Hickory Lane in search of a family and home, something she has never had. Cora Bee has returned to Hickory Lane to recover from a traumatic accident and divorce. The two are brought together by Glory Wynn, their grandmother, and great-aunt, just as a 60-year-old mystery is unearthed. There is a little magic, a lot of gardening, and also decorating. It's set in a small town in Alabama where everyone knows everyone. The characters are well-rounded and very human. I highly recommend it to anyone who wants to escape to a world that draws you in and makes you want to stay. I hated when this was over, but I look forward to her next book which comes out soon—At the Coffee Shop of Curiosities. If you want a read that will captivate you, give this one a try. There are also 2 books I want to suggest for Father's Day: a non-fiction by Simon Sebag Montefiore, *The World*. It is a history of the world through family dynamics. Next, Daniel Silva's new book *The Collector* comes out in July. Until next time, Happy Father's Day.
