







I look forward to certain authors, and Stephen King is at the top of that list. Holly, King's newest release, brings back his character Holly Gibney from the Mr. Mercedes trilogy, The Outsider and If It Bleeds, It Leads. According to King fans, the book is garnering quite a bit of talk-good and bad. The bad isn't in regard to content but seems mostly based on political opinion. But this review is purely about content, and I consider this an excellent book. Holly Gibney is a great heroine, and she has been one of my favorites since her first appearance in Mr. Mercedes. 
