

First, the Longmire Defense by Craig Johnson is excellent in both book and audio form. Next, any of the Bosch series by Michael Connelly-read by Titus Welliver, the actor who plays Bosch on the Amazon series-and I have it on good authority these are all fantastic. I read some great books in 2023. The second annual SCGS fundraising event for the Genealogy Library will take place at the First United Methodist Church located at 2300 Country Club Rd., Duncan, Ok from 1 pm to 3 pm. These desserts will be judged by a panel of judges, and those who are participating are welcome to enter items as individuals, friends family teams, community organizations, businesses, or restaurants! For those who have not visited, the Stephens County Genealogy Library is a branch of the Duncan Public Library and is staffed by Kristi King 20 hours per week. The library holds a collection of over 10,000 items and vertical files. The primary focus is on Stephens County but there is information on not only all Oklahoma counties but almost every US state as well as international, genealogical information. It provides computers for public use and access to databases such as Ancestry.com and Fold 3. The library holds all available microfilm for The Comanche Times, Duncan Banner, Duncan Eagle, The Marlow Review, and various other short-lived, local papers. The library also has various telephone directories, yearbooks, and school records. The Memory Lab is also located in this library with equipment to help you convert all of your cherished memories from outdated formats into your own digital archive that can easily be shared and passed on to future generations. We have the equipment to convert VHS, Microfilm, 8mm and Super 8 film, files stored on 3.5 floppy disk, and a BookEdge scanner that will adjust to the thickness of your beloved heirloom scrapbooks and allow for the full page to lie flat while scanning! 
Crime & Comedy:
