It also connects you to digital books you can listen to or read wherever you may be and databases that provide everything from information on vehicles, legal documents, newspapers from the past, homework help, genealogy resources, and learning a new language. The library also has a large selection of DVDs and Video Games, and we still have Cake Pans and Board Games for checkout!

Having your library card expands your reach into the world beyond your own backyards. Explore new places, different times in history, genres, and voices with just one trip to the library. Getting yours is as simple as applying online on our website, or coming in to fill out an application. You will need to provide a photo ID and other proof of address when getting your library card (if applying online, just bring those items in when you come to pick up your card). It's been a busy summer for me on the reading front with book series being my go-to. An English historical/romance/mystery series I enjoy is Dianne Freeman's Lady Harleigh series. I just read A Fiancee's Guide to First Wives and Murder. This is number four in the series, and I have started number five but got sidetracked. Set in 1890s England, book four follows Lady Frances, an American heiress whose deceased first husband was an Earl. This is a great series if you like cozy mysteries. If you like the time frame and want a more historical angle, try Tasha Alexander's Lady Emily series. Or a series set in Regency England, C.S. Harris's Lord Sebastian St. Cyr. All three of these series are excellent and each has great protagonists and locations. I also finished Daniel Silva's The Collector. I strongly recommend it to all those who like his books and who are also fans of Steve Berry. Gabriel Allon is one of my favorite characters, and this book has relevance to current events, which some may enjoy. I discovered a new author at the end of July; her name is Jane Thornley and her two Phoebe McCabe series are action-packed, modern, and involve stolen art or treasure. She is entertaining, and I really like the protagonist and, of course, the settings. I am excited about several books to be released in the fall, but one that stands out is Holly by Stephen King. In this, King brings back a wonderful character, Holly Gibney, from his Mr. Mercedes trilogy and Outsider. Craig Johnson's new Longmire will also be arriving in September, so be on the lookout for that. Once again, so many books, and so little time. Unless you don't sleep, of course...
