GOVERNOR GREG ABBOTT'S EXECUTIVE ORDERS

- **Effective May 21, 2021,** mask wearing is no longer required to visit the library.
 - In compliance with Governor Greg Abbott's Executive Order No. GA-36, which prohibits governmental entities in Texas – including counties, cities, school districts, public health authorities, or government officials – from requiring or mandating mask wearing.
 - "Texans...should decide their best health practices." [May 18, 2021, press release]
- **Effective March 10, 2021,** the library is open at 100% capacity.
 - In compliance with Governor Greg Abbott's Executive Order No. GA-34, which increased the capacity of all businesses and facilities in the state to 100 percent.
 - Patrons no longer need to schedule an appointment to utilize library services.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

The safety and wellbeing of our patrons and staff is always a top priority.

The Robert J. Kleberg Public Library will continue to:

- clean and disinfect returned books and shared surfaces daily, and
- follow the latest guidance from government and public health officials.

Based on *Texas Department of State Health Services* guidance, the Kleberg Public Library recommends that patrons *consider* the safety measures listed below:

- wear a mask in indoor public spaces, and
- stay 6 feet from others not in your household.
